GROUP A STREPTOCOCCAL (STREP A) INFECTIONS AND SCARLET FEVER

You will have heard or read about several cases nationwide, and we wanted to give you some advice regarding both conditions.

Persons with Strep A are more likely to suffer from throat infections, impetigo (which we have had recently in school), scarlet fever, cellulitis or other more serious illnesses.

Strep A and scarlet fever start with symptoms such as high fever, severe muscle aches, pain in one area of the body and unexplained vomiting or diarrhoea. If you or your child suffers from these, the UK Health Security Agency recommends contacting NHS 111 and seeking medical help immediately. Both are usually treated with antibiotics.

If any member of your family suffers from either of these infections, please take medical advice about returning to school and any exclusion periods.
