ST. PIUS V, POPE - FEAST DAY- 30TH APRIL 2023



"The Pope and God are the same, so he has all power in Heaven and earth." - St. Pius V

St. Pius V, was born Antonio Chislieri in 1504, in Italy. He was Pope from 1566 to 1572. He is most notable for his role in the Council of Trent, the Counter-Reformation, and for standardising the Roman Rite within the Latin Church. He also declared St. Thomas Aquinas a Doctor of the Church. As a Cardinal, he gained a reputation for putting Orthodoxy before personalities, and for prosecuting eight French Bishops for heresy.

He also stood firm against wrong doings, even rebuking his predecessor Pope Pius IV to his face, when he wanted to make a 13-year old member of his family a Cardinal and subsidise another nephew from the Papal treasury. As a Cardinal he knew it was wrong, and didn't hesitate to let it be known. He standardized the Roman Missal, which was used for over 400 years, until 1969 when Pope Paul VI revised it, becoming known as the Tridentine Mass.

Pope Pius V died on May 1, 1572. A tomb was immediately commissioned from the Sculptor Pierre Le Gros the Younger, to be erected in the Sistine Chapel of the Basilica di Santa Maria Maggiore. The Pope's body was placed in it in 1698. Pope Clement X beatified him in 1672, and was later canonised by Pope Clement XI on May 24, 1712. His feast day is celebrated on April 30th, the day before the anniversary of his death.

We envisage that The Dog Mentor Programme will bring a positive influence into the school environment as a whole and look forward to the impact our Dog Mentors will have on our children. Full training will be given to both Bonnie and Baxter and our staff that will work with them in order to ensure that the welfare of everyone involved is maintained as a top priority.
