ST. NICHOLAS DA TOLENTINO, AGOSTINIAN - FEAST DAY 10TH SEPTEMBER

Nicholas of Tolentino (<u>Latin</u>: S. Nicolaus de Tolentino, (c. 1246 – September 10, 1305), known as the Patron of Holy Souls, was an Italian saint and mystic. He is particularly invoked as an advocate for the souls in Purgatory, especially during Lent and the month of November. In many Augustinian churches, there are weekly devotions to St. Nicholas on behalf of the suffering souls. November 2, <u>All Souls' Day</u>, holds special significance for the devotees of St. Nicholas of Tolentino.



ARBOR APP

Hopefully you've had a chance to log in to the new Arbor system and set up your details within the app. You will be able to send messages directly to us via the 'send message' option; this can be used to notify of us of absences or request a call back if you need to chat to us. You will also be able to top up your balance for Little Stars wraparound care and make bookings. School trips will also be set up within the Arbor app for you to give consent and make payments for, and you can also view details of any clubs that your child is enrolled in. Arbor keeps all of your child's details in one central platform, and is an effective communication tool between us and our school families. Please get in touch if you need any help accessing anything within the app.

OUR SCHOOL VIRTUES

Our school's new behaviour policy (which we will upload to the website and notify you of shortly) continues to be rooted in children practising our virtues on a daily basis and being rewarded for great examples of this. We hope that through regular practise, these behaviours become embedded habits, forming the excellent character of our young people as good citizens both in school, and of the future.

Over the summer, our behaviour policy has been updated to encompass the change to our Mission Statement – we now 'FLOURISH IN LOVE' by following our virtues. The attachment as the bottom of the newsletter shows a rough guide to the Virtues display in each classroom, reminding children of their commitment to doing everything they do in a kind and loving way. The colours in the centre also show our move to teaching the children to recognise and manage their emotions using the 'Zones of Regulation', a system which colour codes our feelings and energy and helps us to know when we need to regulate in order to be GREEN and 'good to go' with our learning, as much as possible. A points system is being set up on Arbor, which will keep parents up to date on any virtue or reflection points that their child has been given – more information to follow.

We have also created a regulation room in school, which we have named 'Mount Tabor' and updated the Little Stars room to be a Wellbeing Room throughout the day (also where Bonnie and Baxter will be stationed, ready for work!) which we have named 'Shiloh'. Mount Tabor represents transformation and Shiloh means 'a place of calmness' of Hebrew – Biblical names relating to the use of these two new break-out spaces in school.

The first few days of term have been focussed on the children and staff exploring and getting to know these new routines and procedures, establishing their classroom rules, creating interactive prayer spaces around the school and getting going with their learning for the term. We hope that your children have settled in well and have enjoyed being back at school. - Mrs Cox
