"George's Food Hub opened in September 2022 in the 'BIKE SHED' at St Augustine's School, Kesteven Road, Stamford. The aim being to save as much food waste/surplus as possible. Expansion to other schools, as requested by the schools now means a greater abil

as requested by the schools now means a greater ability to 'SAVE surplus food and SERVE the community'.

Currently we are at;

St Augustine's - 5 days a week (not Tuesdays or Sundays)
Stamford Free Church - 2 days a week (Tuesdays and Thursdays)

Bluecoat School / Children's Centre - Fridays

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SEESAW!

Please do log in to your child's Seesaw account for updates of their amazing learning during their school week; you can access the termly curriculum offering, class learning, and your child's own work.

It's a great way to keep in touch with what your child has been doing, and you will also see information on your child's homework, PE lesson schedule etc.

You can also use Seesaw to upload your child's homework and keep in touch with the class teacher.



E-SAFETY WITH ALAN MACKENZIE

Around 20% of children (8-17) with a social media profile use a false age over 18. This ties in with the numbers I find in Primary schools (KS2) when I'm talking to the children and when I ask why they're using a false age it's usually one of 3 reasons:

- They just use the first age (year of birth) shown when signing up - this is all about the speed of getting into the app.
- They are fully aware that if they give their true age they won't be allowed access.
- Because they've been taught in school, "Don't share personal information online." Be very careful with this message as it can be very confusing for younger children. 'Don't share personal information online' is impossible, it is the context that matters. In other words, "When is it appropriate to share personal information online and what is appropriate to share?".

At St. Augustine's, we try to ensure that children in **every** year group go swimming for at least six weeks a year. To ensure our pupils leave KS2 with the National Curriculum requirement of being able to swim 25m, we do prioritise our upper KS2 classes, who will swim for 12 weeks. Today, Year 5 went swimming for the first time – they were all very excited to leave first thing and came back delighted with the session. Parents, please ensure Y5 are in promptly on a Friday as they children set off walking at 8.50am.
