THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The Stations of the Cross are a traditional Lenten tradition and Catholics are encouraged to pray and think about Jesus' last actions and events before His death on Calvary. Some people refer to this prayer as the Way of the Cross and still today you can trace the actual steps that Jesus took in Jerusalem, Israel.

The Via Dolorosa (The Sorrowful Way) is a processional route in the Old City of Jerusalem. It represents the path that Jesus took, forced by the Roman soldiers, on the way to his crucifixion. The winding route from the former Antonia Fortress to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre—a distance of about 600 metres —is a celebrated place of Christian pilgrimage. The current route has been established since the 18th century, replacing various earlier versions. It is today marked by 14 Stations of the Cross, nine of which are outside, in the streets, with the remaining five stations being currently inside the Church of the Holy Sepulchre.

As this is too far for us to travel from Stamford, perhaps instead we could make our way over to St. Mary and St. Augustine's Church and see the stations for ourselves during the holidays.


