A MESSAGE FROM MRS COX

Welcome back to St. Augustine's! The children have settled back in brilliantly after their half term break and we are looking forward to an exciting term with lots of fun activities and trips.

After a long consultation process with our stakeholders, we have redesigned our school logo and are now in a position to make final decisions on our new school uniform - and we would like your help and input. We have arranged for Shotbowl to bring in some 'prototypes' on mannequins and hangers, with our selected options to choose from; these are now displayed in the front reception area so if you'd like to pop in and have a look at the options, please do so. You can also share your thoughts on the uniform with us by clicking the link here.

The new logo design, as shown above, consists of a cross at the centre to represent our Catholic faith, which places Christ at its core. The 'heart of gold' not only represents our mission statement of 'Let all that you do be done in love', but also what we strive to represent as a loving community. Finally, the golden rays represent the Holy Spirit, radiating out from our school and through our pupils, to all we meet and encounter.

Everybody on the working party has worked very hard to ensure that the new uniform is:

- Cost effective and durable the highest quality items that wear well, for the lowest possible prices
- Smart colours that wash well and will not fade or discolour have been chosen, also allowing easy 'matching' of items bought from local supermarkets without a logo
- Wearable and comfortable it is important that children feel comfortable in uniform, both with the texture and design of items
- Realistic the number of purchasable items with school logo has been reduced. Items with logos will now be:
 - Polo shirt (throughout the whole school, having removed the shirt and tie for KS2)
 - Sweatshirt/cardigan which will be sweatshirt material rather than knitted
 - PE T-shirt
 - Hoodie
 - Other optional items such as book bag, school coat and caps will also be available
 - Items such as shorts and jogging bottoms just need to be navy and won't have logos

DfE guidance on uniforms states that when uniform is changed, there should be a 'sensible transition period' and as such, we will phase our current uniform out over the next year. This means that children will be able to wear uniform with our current logo until September 2025, but after this, we expect all children to be wearing uniform with the new colour and logo. We would like, if at all possible, for children to have at least a polo shirt and a sweatshirt with the new logo and colours as soon as practicable. If you opt for plain supermarket options, please ensure that the colours match the new options once they have been finalised.

In the meantime, we have bought all remaining stock of our current uniform from our school uniform supplier. Shotbowl will now only stock our finalised school uniform ahead of the change in September 2024. The remaining stock of current school uniform that we have purchased will be available from the FoSA uniform shed, to buy at a much reduced price in the meantime.

JUNE - THE MONTH OF THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

June is known as the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus most simply because the solemnity of the Sacred Heart is celebrated during this month. This year, the solemnity is today, June 7. The date changes each year because it is celebrated on the Friday after the Corpus Christi octave, or the Friday after the second Sunday after Pentecost.

The Devotion to the wounded heart of Jesus dates back to the 11th century. Christians would meditate on Christ's passion and suffering and offer prayers to the Sacred Heart. However it wasn't until 1673, when Jesus began to visit Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, a French nun, that we would learn more about this amazing devotion. During these visions, Jesus shared with St. Margaret Mary his immense love for mankind and asked her to spread his message. Margaret Mary had a special devotion to Jesus' passion and death, and she began to receive apparitions of Jesus crowned with thorns.

In December 1673, while she was praying in adoration before the Blessed Sacrament, Margaret Mary heard Jesus speaking to her. He told Margaret Mary that he wanted to spread the love of his heart through her and that she would reveal to many people the grace he desires always to bestow on humanity. In her vision, Margaret Mary saw Jesus take her heart and place it within his, setting it aflame with divine love that continued to burn in her heart as it returned to her body. These apparitions continued for 18 months, and Jesus described his heart, according to Margaret Mary, as "the heart that has so loved humanity that it has spared nothing, even exhausting and consuming itself in testimony of its love."


