A WALK THROUGH HOLY MASS WITH CANON PETER

In his parish newsletter last week, Canon Peter wrote:

"Over the next few weekends, we will be taking a walk-through Holy Mass to see the significance, symbolism and depth to each part of the Mass for our spiritual lives. The basic outline of the celebration of Mass is shown below.

The two principal parts of the Mass are the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. These two form one unified act of worship. We are first nourished at the table of God's word through the readings from Scripture and then at the table of Our Lord's Body, which we receive in Holy Communion. These two central parts of the Mass are flanked by three smaller parts: the Introductory Rites, the Communion Rite and the Concluding Rites.

The Introductory Rites open the celebration of Mass and prepare us for our sacred encounter with God in his Word and in the Eucharist. After Communion, the Concluding Rites formally close the celebration and send us forth to do good works and take Christ into the world. Keeping in mind this overview of the Mass can be helpful as we embark on our journey through Holy Mass in detail."
