It has been wonderful to watch our Y6 pupils mixing happily with a group of lovely children from St. Patrick's Catholic Primary in Wilford, Nottingham, who greeted us on the games field with huge smiles and immediate invites to join in their games. The children have mixed and made friends, both in their teamled retreat groups and free time, which has been a joy to see - high fives in the corridors, cheers on the footy pitch, jostling and comradery during rounders and killer dance moves in the disco are just a few free time highlights. We also enjoyed a lovely walk with our new friends, taking in the local countryside and stunning views!

In their small group activities our children have been gently encouraged them to reflect on their strengths and gifts, the virtues we practise in life to constantly do our best and ways to work together and serve God and the Kingdom. Today ends with a gorgeous 'affirmations' sessions, where they write great things about each other on a big sheet of paper, which each child gets to keep - I still have mine from when I visited in Year 8, a memory I still hold dear today. The children have also taken part in planning Liturgies and Mass, attended Morning Prayers of The Church (which are said around the world) and night prayer, in cosy, softly lit dens around the retreat centre, allowing them to be thoughtful and thankful each day. As ever, we have been immensely proud of the kind, polite, friendly and helpful young people that we have had the pleasure of spending three days with, watching them grow, flourish and enjoy spending time together in these last few weeks of their time with us at St. Augustine's.



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#### THE SIGN OF THE CROSS AND 'THE LORD BE WITH YOU'

"For the early Christians, they understood the Sign of the Cross to be foreshadowed by a mysterious Old Testament sign. In the vision of Ezekiel (Ezekiel 8:9-18) the Lord gives the prophet a vision of the sins being committed by God's people in Jerusalem. Ezekiel tells how, as a result of these, God's presence will leave the Temple. Babylon will destroy Jerusalem and the sanctuary, taking many of the people into exile – but not all will suffer this fate.

Those marked with the tahv are the righteous people who remain faithful to God in the midst of all this: they are deeply grieved over the way God is being rejected by the rest of the people. This sign by background of the mark in Ezekiel, we see that the Sign of the Cross sets us apart. By making it we express our desire to be faithful to God, not to live according to the standards of this world, but to have our whole lives marked by Christ's cross.

from all harm and evil - most of all, from sin. In the Sign of the Cross, we call on God's name: 'In the 2:9-11; John 14:13), and we confess him as Lord and invoke his very presence (Matthew 18:20) as we prepare to encounter Him in Word and Sacrament.

> The Sign of the Cross is followed by the Christian greeting, 'The Lord be with you' and is used three times in the Mass and several times throughout the Bible. In fact, it is used by God or his angels to address someone who is being The greeting offers encouragement, as it did for the above, reminding
