This Sunday, 8th September, is Education Sunday, just as the new academic year starts and is one of the oldest Days of Special Prayer in England and Wales, established 176 years ago in 1848.

It provides an opportunity to celebrate and give thanks to all involved in making Catholic schools places of enlightenment, as well as to look forward in anticipation of the year ahead.

In his letter to all Brothers and Sisters in Christ, Marcus Stock, Bishop of Leeds and Chairman of the Catholic Education Service, wrote:

"Christ is the foundation of the whole educational enterprise in a Catholic school. As "the way, the truth, and the life" Christ is both the object and subject of Catholic education. A Catholic educational institution seeks to root the Gospel of Christ in the minds and lives of students, providing a holistic formation that promotes human flourishing, inspiring a lifelong love of learning, and fostering the virtues that will assist children and young people to discover in themselves and in others the Truth, Goodness and Beauty of God.

Cybersurvey

I shared this in July but there are now two versions: one for primary schools and one for secondary.

The Cybersurvey is an annual survey/report is one of the richest databases of young people's views on digital life, created by Youthworks since 2008 it explores what it's like growing up in a digital world with over 53,000 young people in England.

It is extremely useful for staff training, understanding trends and much more, exploring topics such as youth produced images, gambling, meeting up, bullying, harmful content, his risk situations and more.
