THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS

In his parish newsletter last week, Canon Peter wrote: "Holy Orders is the Sacrament by which a baptised man receives the authority and power to share in the particular mission that Christ entrusted to his apostles. It flows from Jesus Christ himself, who chose twelve men whom he called apostles and gave them the commission and power to govern with his authority (Mt 18:18); teach in his name (Mt 28:19-20) and sanctify with the grace of his sacraments (Lk 22:19).

The apostles conferred Holy Orders on their successors, who in turn ordained men for service through the laying on of hands and consecratory prayer according to the mind of the Church. Today in the person of Christ those in Holy Orders:

Govern - by uniting, protecting and leading the faithful to their heavenly homeland. Teach – by preaching and explaining the Word of God and Tradition with authority Sanctify - by conferring the sacraments and interceding with God for his people.

Bishops - who are the successors to the apostles. They usually govern dioceses, can confer Holy Orders on others, and normally administer the sacrament of Confirmation. Together with the Pope they exercise an infallible teaching authority for the whole Church.

Priests - are co-workers of the bishops, particularly as governors and teachers of parishes. They sanctify the faithful through the celebration of the Eucharist, the forgiveness of sins in Confession, Baptism and the Anointing of the Sick. They also preside at Marriages.

> Deacons - assist the work of the bishop and his priests, especially by assisting at the altar, proclaiming the gospel and works of charity. While a promise of lifelong celibacy is the normal condition for reception of Holy Orders, that one may give the whole of their life to Christ and His Church, a permanent deacon may be married."
