REFLECTION

In last week's parish newsletter, Canon Peter wrote:

'The people in this weekend's Gospel are "filled with expectation." They believe John the Baptist might be the messiah they've been waiting for. Three times we hear their question: "What, then, shall we do?" The messiah's coming requires every man and woman to choose—to "repent" or not. That's John's message and it will be Jesus' too.

"Repentance" translates a Greek word, metanoia (literally, "change of mind"). In the Scriptures, repentance is presented as a twofold "turning"—away from sin (cf. Ezekiel 3:19; 18:30) and toward God (cf. Sirach 17:20–21; Hosea 6:1). This "turning" is more than attitude adjustment. It means a radical life change. It requires "good fruits as evidence of your repentance" (cf. Luke 3:8). That's why John tells the crowds, soldiers, and tax collectors they must prove their faith through works of charity, honesty, and social justice.

In this weekend's Liturgy, each of us is being called to stand in that crowd and hear the "good news" of John's call to repentance. We should examine our lives, asking from our hearts as they did: "What, then, shall we do?" Our repentance should spring not from our fear of coming wrath but from a joyful sense of the nearness of our saving God.

It is this theme that resounds through the readings: "Rejoice! . . . The Lord is at hand: do not be anxious about anything," we hear in the Epistle. And in the Responsorial Psalm, we hear again the call to be joyful, unafraid at the Lord's coming among us. While in the First Reading, we hear echoes of the angel's Annunciation to Mary. The prophet's words are very close to the angel's greeting (cf. Luke 1:28–31). Mary is the Daughter Zion—the favoured one of God, told not to fear but to rejoice that the Lordis with her, "a mighty one who will save". She is the cause of our joy. For in her draws near the Messiah, as John had promised: "he who is mightier than I is coming."

JUBILEE YEAR - 2025 - PILGRIMS OF HOPE

Pope Francis has declared 2025 a Jubilee Year—a time for forgiveness and reconciliation. It is an wonderful opportunity to deepen our relationship with God, one another, and all of creation as we come together to celebrate our Catholic faith.

The Jubilee Year begins with a momentous event; on Christmas Eve 2024, Pope Francis will open the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica in the Vatican. A Holy Door is one of the entrances that are usually sealed shut, and is only opened during Jubilee Years.

Jubilee Years, celebrated every 25 years, hold deep significance in the Catholic Church. The Diocese of Nottingham will officially open its Jubilee Year on 29th December 2024, with schools joining in the celebration with a dedicated day on Friday 24th January 2025.

This sacred year will conclude on 6th January 2026, the solemnity of The Epiphany, marking the culmination of a profound journey of faith and unity.

Let us embrace this Jubilee Year with open hearts, ready to renew our hope and discover a vision that can 'restore access to the fruits of the earth to everyone' and we are encouraged to 'contemplate the beauty of creation and care for our common home'.
