REFLECTION

In last week's parish newsletter, Canon Peter wrote:

'The Liturgy last weekend revealed the mystery of God's plan—that in Jesus all peoples, symbolized by the Magi, have been made coheirs to the blessings promised to Israel. This weekend, we're shown how we claim our inheritance.

Jesus doesn't submit to John's baptism as a sinner in need of purification. He humbles Himself to pass through Jordan's waters in order to lead a new exodus opening up the promised land of heaven so that all peoples can hear the words pronounced over Jesus in the Gospel, words once reserved only for Israel and its king: that each of us is a beloved son or daughter of God.

Jesus is the chosen servant Isaiah prophesies in this weekend's First Reading, anointed with the Spirit to make things right and just on earth. God puts His Spirit upon Jesus to make Him a covenant of the people, the liberator of captives, the light to the nations. Jesus is the One long expected in Israel, the Messiah, "anointed... with the Holy Spirit and power." The word 'Messiah' means "one anointed" with God's Spirit. King David was "the anointed of the God of Jacob" (cf. 2 Samuel 23:1–17; Psalm 18:51; 132:10, 17). The prophets taught Israel to await a royal offshoot of David, upon whom the Spirit would rest (cf. Isaiah 11:1–2; Daniel 9:25).

hat's why the crowds are so anxious at the start of the Gospel this weekend. But it isn't John they're looking for. God confirms with His own voice what the angel earlier told Mary: Jesus is the Son of the Most High, come to claim the throne of David forever. In the Baptism that He brings, the voice of God will hover over the waters. He has sanctified the waters, made them a passageway to healing andfreedom—a fountain of new birth and everlasting life for all.




EXTRA-ORDO-NARY 'WORD OF THE WEEK'
