I also received a letter this week from Peter Giorgio, the Trust's Director of Education, and would like to share the following excerpt with you: 'The pastoral care shown to pupils and their families is also a highlight of your leadership, which is one of the many reasons why the school has thrived under your care. Personal development is also recognised by you and your dedicated staff as imperative for building an understanding of good character and social responsibility: the opportunities you provide are helping pupils to realise their worth in order to make a positive difference to others, and the wider world. The good behaviour shown by pupils, and the systems in place to support those who need help with self-regulation, reflect the calm and purposeful atmosphere you have created at St Augustine's. PLAYGROUND LEADERS


We are delighted to announce that we now have official playground leaders!






EXTRA-ORDO-NARY 'WORD OF THE WEEK'

EXCITING NEW BREAKFAST INITIATIVE AT ST. A'S!

You may have read that the Department for Education (DfE) is implementing a new breakfast club scheme later this year. As part of our ongoing commitment to supporting the well-being of our children, we are delighted to announce that we will be trialling our own breakfast initiative when we return after half-term on Monday, 24th February.

This trial is being generously supported and provided for by George's Food Hub and aims to ensure that every child has the best possible start to their day. If your child has not had breakfast at home, they are welcome to come to the dining hall between 8.40am and 9.00am to help themselves to a nutritious breakfast. Mrs Smith, our Family Support Worker, will be coordinating this provision and will work with all children that drop in, guiding them on the life skills involved in making their own breakfast and helping to clear away, which we believe are valuable skills. We also hope that this will provide a 'soft landing' for any pupils who find the start of the school day a busy or difficult time.

We believe that a good breakfast, eaten in a safe space with others, sets children up for success, helping them to feel ready to learn and thrive throughout the school day. We look forward to seeing

the positive impact this initiative will have on our pupils!


