## A MESSAGE FROM MRS COX

What a fantastic week we've had in school! The sun has been shining, lifting everyone's spirits as we busily prepare for our V.E. Day celebration on Thursday 8th May. Excitement is building as we look forward to welcoming families to share in this special occasion. On Thursday, we were delighted to have Mrs Pattison join us as part of The Vintage Singers ensemble, helping us learn some wonderful songs that we'll perform at the event. We've also had thoughtful discussions about the Conclave, with children exploring how a new Pope is chosen. On Tuesday, we came together as a Diocese in prayer for Pope Francis, uniting online in a moment of reflection and faith.

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION – CHANGES TO THE MORNING ROUTINE:

Pupils' attendance figures (including lateness) were highlighted by Ofsted as an area that our school must continue to improve.

Last year, we changed the morning routine in school to ensure that our pupils and families arrived on time and pupils were in their classrooms with their belongings away, ready to learn by 8.45am, which is the official start to our day. Currently, gates open at 8.30am, children line up when the bell rings at 8.40am and are collected by a member of staff to lead smartly into school.

From Tuesday, **this routine is changing** to ensure an even smoother start, again encouraging punctuality and readiness to learn by 8.45am. I would value your support in ensuring these changes are put into effect immediately, by making any necessary changes to your morning routines.

### NEW MORNING ROUTINE AT ST. AUGUSTINE'S:

- **8.35am** – Playground gates unlocked. Sensory Circuits opens.
- **8.35–8.40am** – 10-minute 'drift in' period. Children should enter their classroom straight away on arrival, through the classroom fire door. They will no longer be asked to line up.
- **8.45am** – All children should be in class and seated, ready to learn. Gates will be locked.

For anything you may wish to discuss with the class teacher, please put a note on Seesaw or in your child's reading diary and alert the teacher to this, so they can get back to you. Teachers will begin their day with the children on entry, completing 'mindful morning' activities from 8.35am, and doors will be manned by TAs with notebooks who can pass on any messages.

All parents should be off-site and gates locked by 8.45am. Anyone arriving later than this will need to sign in at the front office, and any arrivals after 9.00am - when registers close - will be marked as late. **Any child arriving in school after 9.15am will, by law, be recorded as an unauthorised absence for the entire school morning.**

For those pupils who may not have eaten breakfast before school, for whatever reason, Mrs Smith and Miss Bush will continue to provide this daily, stocked by the kind donations from George's Food Hub.

Whilst we love to see our community engaging with one another, many of our pupils attend clubs, interventions or wraparound care after school and, as such, gates need to be locked as soon as possible. **When collecting your children, please leave the school site promptly and ensure you are supervising your children, before and after school, for their safety.** We have had recent reports of unsafe behaviour, such as climbing in restricted areas and damaging trees. During these times, children remain the responsibility of their parents, and we ask for your vigilance in promoting safe and respectful behaviour.

strength - just like Mary showed us.



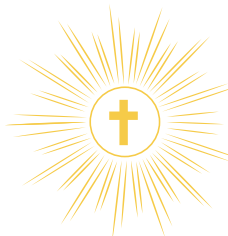
## OUR PARISH CHURCH

## For Parents - More Concerns with Roblox

As one of the more popular games with all age groups, particularly younger children, Roblox is getting its fair share of negative press lately.

Most recently (13th April) Revealing Reality have released results of their investigation called 'A Digital Playground - The Real Guide to Roblox'. As part of this investigation the researchers created multiple account pretending to be persons aged 5, 9, 10, 13 and 40+ in order to explore the safety settings and the user experience which included:

- Adults and children can easily interact.
- Easy access to highly suggestive environments, including participation in adult-themed conversations.

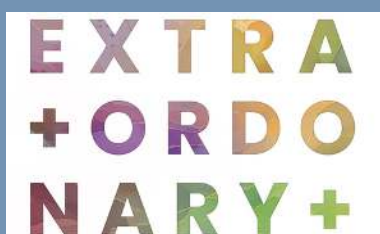


# EXTRA-ORDO-NARY 'WORD OF THE WEEK'

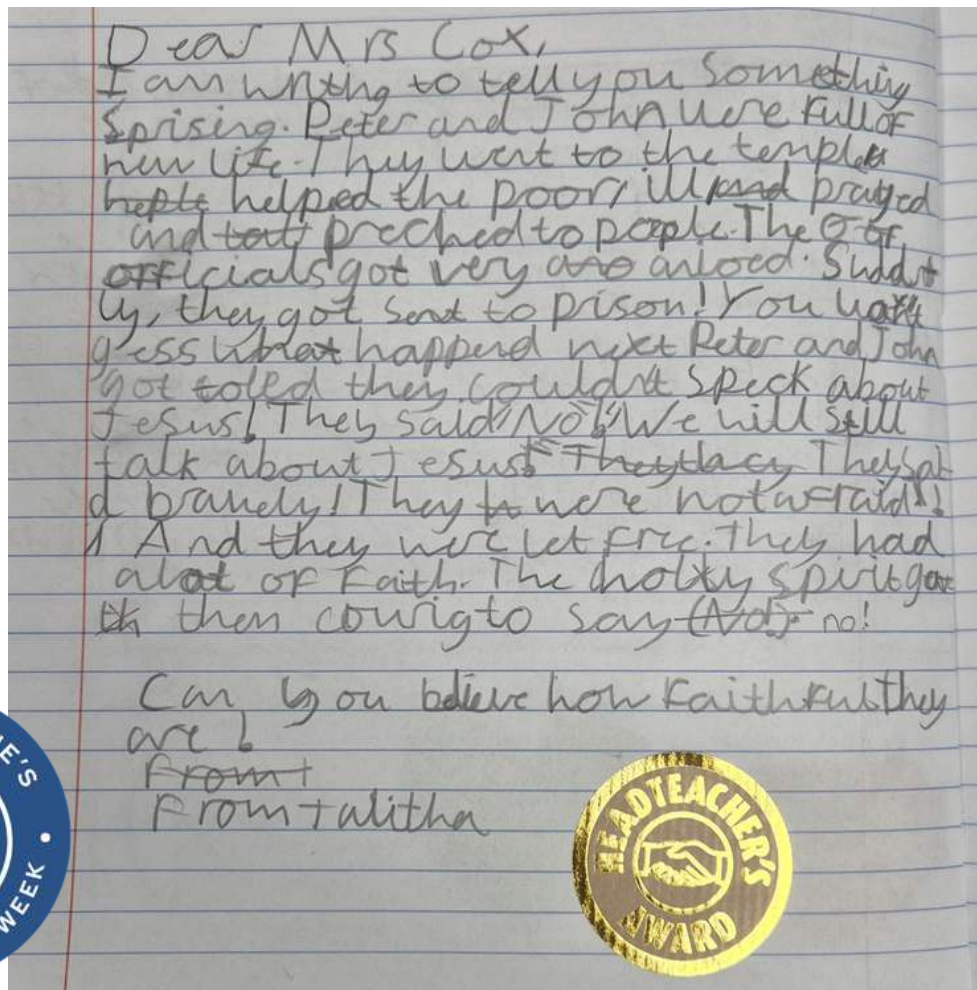

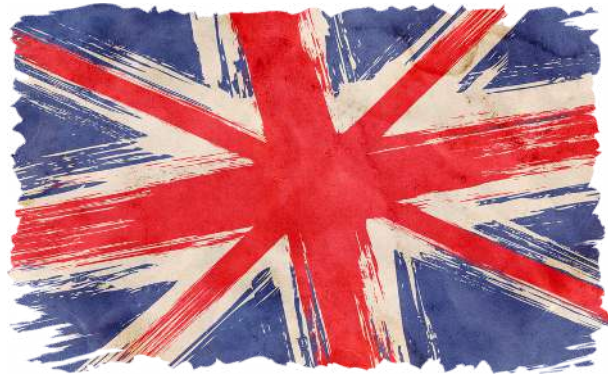
