
A MESSAGE FROM MRS WITHERS

A poem for Remembrance Sunday which invites us to transform the world from hate to love. by Father Mark Skelton:


The petal falls and lies on soil of blood, and every flower bends beneath the hate. A silent cry will stretch to reach the fear, and men of peace will wait in shades of shame.

The Impact of News on Children - Internet Matters

The world is one of cycles. The current generation moving through the school system, are doing so in a time of particular instability. The consequence for the media landscape has been a shift from 'light' news to a constant stream of 'heavy' content. Online this trend has been inescapable whether to drive clicks or generate controversy, increasingly our media consumption has been overtaken by gloom.

This pessimistic outlook has been further enhanced by the continuing evolution of Al. News stories that would have once been unquestioned, now straddle the line of real and fake. For children and young people whose critical faculties are not yet fully developed, this can provoke a whirlwind of confusion. Confusion tends to breed negative mental health effects since one can no longer distinguish true from false.

Ahead of World Adoption Day on Sunday, and Remembrance Day on Tuesday, we have some lovely non-fiction book recommendations exploring these themes.




