THE CHILDREN'S COMMISSIONER FOR ENGLAND

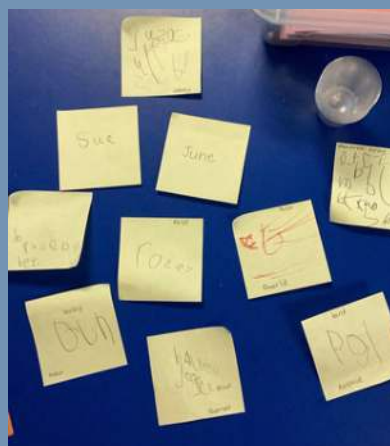

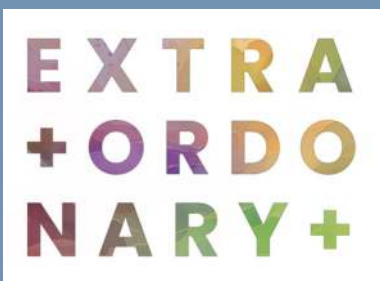
Our new doll, Baby Betty will live in the Home Corner of Olive Class. Welcome to St. Augustine's, Baby Betty!

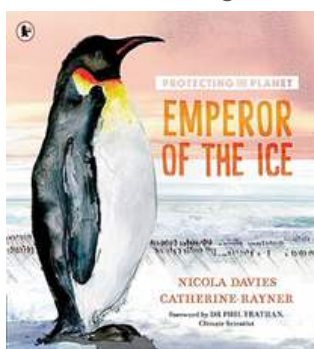
