We have now entered the First Week in Ordinary Time, the season between Christmas and Lent. This is often a calmer time of year and a lovely opportunity to settle back into routines and reflect on the weeks just gone. Here at St Augustine's, we are also settling into some new routines. In the classroom, many children are excited about their new topics and are embracing their new timetables – please see Seesaw for more information. Some of your children may have mentioned the Jubilee Room. This is a classroom that is open at lunchtime, offering a range of activities away from the hustle and bustle of the playground. It provides a calm and welcoming space where pupils can relax and enjoy some quieter time if they wish.

2026 is the National Year of Reading – Go All In!

At St Augustine's, we love reading and are passionate about helping children discover the joy of books in many ways.

At the start of their journey, pupils learn to read through our phonics scheme. In EYFS and Key Stage One, children also enjoy listening to stories read aloud by their teacher and spending time in our school library.

As pupils move into Key Stage Two, their reading journey continues with class novels, lively discussions about characters and storylines, and independent reading. Our Accelerated Reading programme adds an element of fun and motivation, with quizzes and points to earn along the way. Pupils also enjoy visiting the library and taking part in paired reading with younger children.

Reading is woven throughout the curriculum, with non-fiction books and extracts used to support learning across subjects. Children also continue to love listening to their teachers read aloud and are often completely captivated by the stories they share.

We know that many of you enjoy sharing books at home and listening to your children read, and we are very grateful for your support. This term, we will be launching some exciting new activities to promote reading—please keep an eye out for our Open Library sessions and Reading Café events. This week, we also have two 'Writers of the Week' with wonderful submissions from Michael and Bella - we just couldn't choose between them!

I hope you have a restful and enjoyable weekend, and I look forward to another busy and happy week in school.

I hope you are having a blessed week and a great start to the new term! I'm delighted to share with you our brand new celebration of the Word videos. The Mark 10 Mission video this week is particularly beautiful and profound. During filming, we were able to bring Jesus from the tabernacle at Hinsley Hall and expose the Blessed Sacrament whilst Sr Thérèse recorded her reflection. I pray that as children look upon Jesus in the monstrance, the reality of his true presence in the Eucharist can move and impact their hearts.

We chose to record a period of Adoration because of the words of St John the Baptist in next Sunday's Gospel. He says 'Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!' as Jesus comes towards him. We want to help children know that they, like John, can point others towards Jesus and that he is always moving towards them... most especially in the Holy Eucharist.

ROBLOX: SETTINGS THAT HELP KEEP CHILDREN SAFER

Roblox can be a creative and enjoyable space, but because games and social spaces are created by users, children's experiences can vary widely. Many children start playing in primary school, often sharing games and conversations with much older users. Settings help, but they work best when combined with regular conversations and adult interest.

Most problems on Roblox don't come from the games themselves, but from social interaction — messaging, voice chat, group spaces and contact with people your child doesn't know. Safety settings are most effective when children understand why they are in place and feel able to talk about what they experience online.

Helpful conversation starters

- What games are you enjoying at the moment?
- Who do you usually play with?
- Has anything online ever made you feel uncomfortable, confused or upset?

Keeping conversations open makes it much easier for children to ask for help if something doesn't feel right.

Key settings to check:

| Setting | What it affects | A safer starting point |
|-----------------------------|---|--|
| Account age & content level | What types of games and experiences your child can access, including older-teen content | Set the account to your child's real age and choose a lower content maturity level |
| Age verification | How Roblox groups users into age brackets | Make sure age verification reflects your child's real age |
| Text chat | Who can send and receive messages | Limit chat to friends only or turn it off for younger children |
| Voice chat | Live voice conversations during some games | Turn off unless you are confident and actively supervising |
| Party / group chat | Group conversations that continue across games | Restrict or disable for younger users |
| Friends & contacts | Who can add your child as a friend | Restrict requests and review the friends list regularly |
| Private servers | Who can invite your child to private game spaces | Allow invites only from people your child knows offline |
| Public multiplayer games | Playing with large numbers of unknown users | Encourage smaller or friend-only spaces where possible |
| Screen time limits | How long your child can play each day | Agree clear daily limits that work for your family |
| In-game spending | Buying Robux and premium items | Set spending limits or require approval for purchases |
| Parental activity tools | Summaries of what your child plays and who they interact with | Link a parent account and review activity together |
