This happened a long time ago, but people still remember it because Mary's message was simple and kind. She reminded everyone that God loves them and is always close, especially when life feels hard.

One special part of the story is a spring of water that appeared at Lourdes. Many people believe this water is a sign of hope and healing.

Today, people from all over the world visit Lourdes to pray, to feel peaceful, and to remember that care and kindness can help us feel better inside.

The story of Our Lady of Lourdes teaches us important things we can live out every day: being gentle, looking after those who are unwell or sad, and trusting that we are never alone. On her feast day, we can remember to show love in small ways; through a smile, a prayer, or helping someone who needs us.

Lemon8 is an app which seems to be growing in popularity. Calling itself a 'lifestyle community' app the terms and conditions, as per most social media, is 13+. The company which owns Lemon8 is ByteDance, who also own TikTok and it's essentially a mix between Instagram and TikTok. Reviews generally seem to be quite positive but one of the big downfalls is that parental features are a little lacking.




EXTRA-ORDO-NARY 'WORD OF THE WEEK'
